## <u>City Policy regarding use of public outdoor space</u> <u>April 1, 2021 until Governor's Emergency Order Lifted.</u>

- Beginning April 1, 2021, if the pandemic-related Governor's State of Emergency Order 3 and the pandemic-related ABCC guidelines are still in place, the following policy for 4 sidewalk dining on City property shall be in effect, subject to any changes in the 5 6 Governor's State of Emergency Order. 7 The City will utilize a similar operating plan for sidewalk dining as was in place until 8 November 1, 2020 during the Governor's State of Emergency Order. An annual City 9 issued permit, application available on the City website, will be required for an establishment to operate sidewalk dining. The permit for sidewalk dining expires when 10 11 the Governor's State of Emergency Order is lifted. The State or the City of Rehoboth Beach may also revoke the permit at any time. 12 The City will review and approve or deny all applications. The City will issue sidewalk 13 dining permits which may allow a food service establishment located in the commercial 14 area to operate sidewalk dining on public property, subject to the following; 15 1) Establishment serving food must possess a current City-issued business license. 16 2) Establishment must not exceed total dining capacity requirements approved prior 17 to the State of Emergency, as established in the Permit of Compliance. 18 3) Establishment must abide by all existing rules and regulations for food safety as 19 directed by the State Department of Public Health. 20 21 4) Establishment, if possessing a valid ABCC license, must abide by all existing rules and regulations for the service of alcohol as directed by the State Alcohol 22 Beverage Control Commission. 23 5) Establishment must abide by all existing rules and regulations for food and 24 beverage establishments as directed by the Governor's State of Emergency 25

- Current business license holders must submit a completed application for
   sidewalk dining by February 15, 2021.
- All applications from establishments with liquor licenses, once approved by the City, will then be provided to the Alcohol Beverage Control Commission (ABCC) for their approval. City sidewalk dining permit issuance is dependent on the approval of the ABCC.

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- 33 7) Street traffic barriers are to be used to create a pedestrian walkway, in parking
   34 spaces, where the sidewalk pedestrian walkway has been blocked by sidewalk
   35 dining.
- 8) To maintain the health, safety and welfare of pedestrians, traffic barriers must
   conform to City of Rehoboth Beach and DelDOT public safety standards and only
   the traffic barriers obtained from the City of Rehoboth Beach may be used.
- 39 9) Traffic barriers will be available beginning April 1, 2021. Payment for rental of
  40 barriers is at the expense of the sidewalk dining permit holder, and payment must
  41 be received by the City before any barrier is provided to the establishment. The
  42 rental cost per barrier will be equal to the cost of the barrier incurred by the City.
  43 The City will contract with a business to obtain the best rental cost per traffic
  44 barrier.
- 45 10)Food and beverages may be served only to seated patrons.
- 46 11)<u>There shall be no live entertainment on the sidewalk.</u>
- 47 12)<u>There shall be no external speakers or amplifiers on the sidewalk and no internal</u>
   48 <u>speakers from the premises are to be directed to the sidewalk.</u>
- 49 13)<u>There shall be no bar on the sidewalk.</u>
- 14)<u>If alcohol is served with a valid Alcoholic Board Control Commission permit, a</u>
   physical barrier to separate the tables from the pedestrian walkway and define
   the sidewalk dining area, not less than 42 inches high, constructed of wood,
   concrete, plastic, wrought iron, dense vegetation or other materials approved by
   the City of Rehoboth Beach, must be in place adjacent to the tables closest to
   the curb line.
- 56 15)There shall be no food/beverage preparation on the sidewalk.
- 57 16)A separation between tables of 8' minimum is required.
- 58 17)<u>Tables & chairs must not block any entrance or ADA accessible areas.</u>
- 59 18)Sidewalk dining permit area shall close by 11:00 P.M. and vacated by 11:30 P.M.
- 19)Umbrellas shall have a maximum diameter of eight (8) feet and must have a
   weighted base.
- 20)Tents or canopies, without sides, may be used on City property, if approved in
   advance by the City Manager.

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- 21)The sidewalk dining permit shall not be in effect unless and until the applicant 64 files with the City a certificate of liability insurance confirming that the applicant 65 66 has procured a policy of commercial general liability insurance issued by an 67 insurance company authorized to do business in the state of Delaware. The policy shall provide in substance that the insurer will defend against all claims 68 and lawsuits which arise and will pay any final judgment of a court of competent 69 70 jurisdiction against the City, its officers, agents or employees. The insurance shall provide coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for each 71 72 single occurrence. The policy of insurance shall name both the applicant and the 73 city as insured parties to the full amount of the policy limits. If the policy is not 74 kept in full force and effect throughout the term of this sidewalk dining permit, the permit may be terminated by the City upon providing written notice of termination 75 76 to applicant.
- 22)The sidewalk dining permit shall not be in effect unless and until the applicant
   files with the City a complete and valid waiver of indemnification agreement.
- 23)The City Code Enforcement Officer will be responsible for monitoring and
   assuring compliance, and reporting findings to the City Manager, Mayor and
   Commissioners.
- 82 24)Exceptions, upon the demonstration of need or hardship, may be granted, in 83 writing, by the City Manager.
